<p>Digitised content (PDF) from a printed book</p> <p>Rely on the Statutory Licence: 1 chapter or 10%, whichever is greater, per subject. Request digitisation via Reading List. More can be copied if the book is out of print (consult Copyright staff).</p>			n/a	
<p>eBook</p> <p>Provide a permalink from the ebook or the Library catalogue, this can be done automatically via Reading List.</p>	 (Reading List will provide a link when item is added)	 (Add link in the LMS)	n/a	Depends. Check terms and conditions
<p>Digitised printed journal article (PDF)</p> <p>Rely on the Statutory Licence: 1 article from any one issue. More may be copied if they are on the same topic. Request digitisation via Reading List.</p>			n/a	
<p>Electronic article (PDF) from a Library database</p> <p>Provide a permalink to the article or its record in the Library catalogue, this can be done automatically via Reading List.</p>	 (Reading List will provide a link when item is added)	 (Add link in the LMS)	n/a	Depends. Check terms and conditions

<p>Digitised image from a printed book</p> <p>Rely on the Statutory Licence: used to explain text. Must be attributed and accompanied by a Copyright Warning Notice.</p>				
<p>An online image</p> <p>Rely on the Statutory Licence. Must be attributed and accompanied by a Copyright Warning Notice</p>				
<p>Documents found online</p> <p>Check terms and conditions. Best practice is to link to the document or to the webpage containing the link to the document. Otherwise, Statutory Licence may apply, request can be made via Reading List.</p>	 Add item and link to Reading List	 Add or embed link in the LMS	n/a	Depends. Check terms and conditions
<p>Articles, documents and images found online with open licences attached</p> <p>Items with a Creative Commons or open licence can be used, must abide by the terms of the licence used, including attribution.</p>				
<p>TV and radio broadcasts</p> <p>Rely on the Statutory Licence: recordings of TV & radio broadcasts, including free to air TV and Pay TV that have been broadcast in Australia. Best practice is to use permalinks from EduTV or TVNews. . Streaming services (eg Netflix) cannot be used.</p>				
<p>Commercially produced DVDs & videos</p> <p>Items purchased, rented from a store or borrowed from the Library are not covered by the Statutory Licence.</p>			 Pause recording of lecture while playing the video	n/a
<p>Music and sound recordings</p> <p>CDs and sound recordings can be used and copied under the Music Licence. Attribute appropriately. Streaming services (eg Spotify) cannot be used.</p>				

<p>YouTube</p> <p>Standard Terms of Use do not allow YouTube videos to be downloaded, copied, recorded or modified. Only videos with a Creative Commons Licence can be recorded in a lecture or downloaded.</p>	 Use embeddable link	 Use embeddable link	 Pause recording of lecture while playing the video	n/a
<p>Your own lecture notes or UTS owned material</p>				
<p>Material produced by UTS students (eg from previous assessment tasks)</p> <p>As per the Student Rule 3.9, permission is required to use student work as teaching case study material.</p>	Permission required	Permission required	Permission required	Permission required
